

Mwambui Primary School, Kenya

Just a Drop is pleased to provide details of a project in Kenya, at Mwambui Primary School for Tellurium Q.

As you'll see, there are 346 children who attend the school, which has no regular supply of water and this is really holding them back.

Just a Drop will change this, we will construct a rain water harvesting tank which will provide sufficient safe water all year round. We will also build hand washing stations and provide hygiene education, to make sure that the children can stay healthy into the long-term.

From the project, we'll look to provide high quality images to help bring to life the work you're supporting. We can also provide stories and films and provide reports on progress for you to use the impact being achieved.

Mwambui Primary School Kenya (Ref: 405/AF/18)

Mwambui School is attended by 346 children in an arid, rural area where there is limited water, Kitui County.

The GPS coordinates of the school are:
0°44'56.9"S 38°02'02.9"E



Mwambui School has no regular supply of water. The school is often required to buy water from vendors, an expensive business and to the detriment of the school's development and the children's educational opportunities.

Children are also often sent to fetch water from a nearby river, but the water from there isn't clean, leading to illness.



To address this, Just a Drop will provide a water tank (like the one shown above) for the school to provide year round safe and clean water, a tank which harvests water from the school roof during the two Kenyan rainy seasons. We will also provide three hand washing stations and sanitation and hygiene education to every student on how best to use the water to stay healthy.

The impact of this work will be clear:

- Children will have sufficient water to drink and to cook with
- Children are able to spend more time in school, with time not lost to illness or through having to fetch water
- The school will be able to develop using the money previously spent on water – for new classrooms, a laboratory, or for growing food
- There will be extra water to address hygiene issues at the school, leading to long-term health



When Just a Drop visited the school, we spoke to the children there. One of them, Grace Musembi, said:

“We have a serious water crisis here in school, because there is not sufficient water supply to cater for all of us. We are only provided with a very small amount each day for washing and bathing, it’s not easy to manage with all the water needs”.

All of the children were positive about their futures, they were bright and intelligent – providing access to safe and clean water will help enormously.
